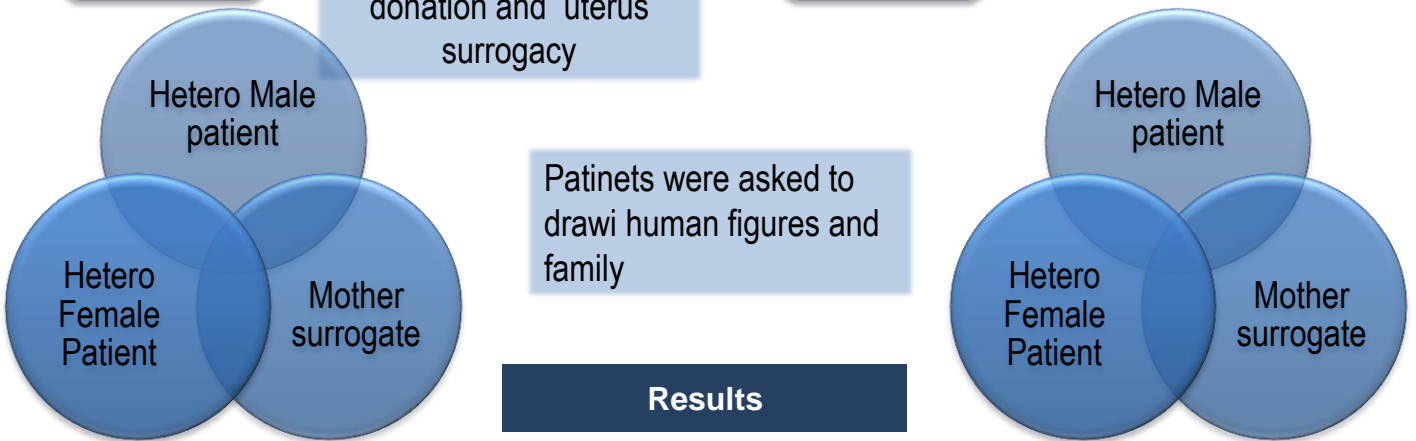
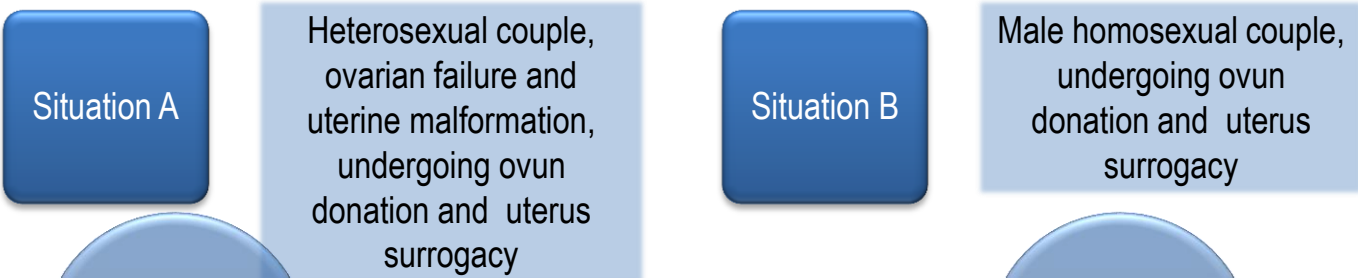
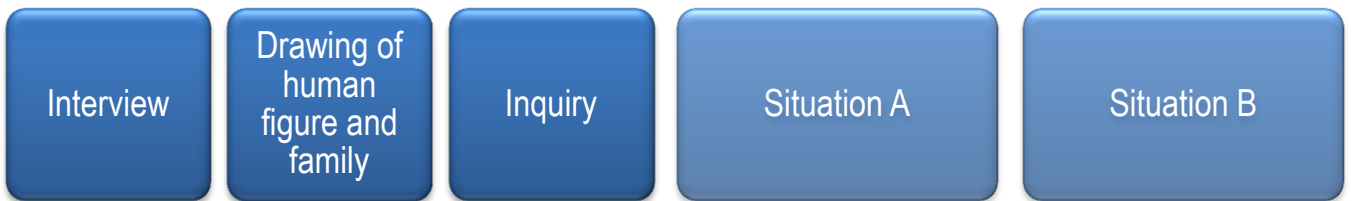
Objective

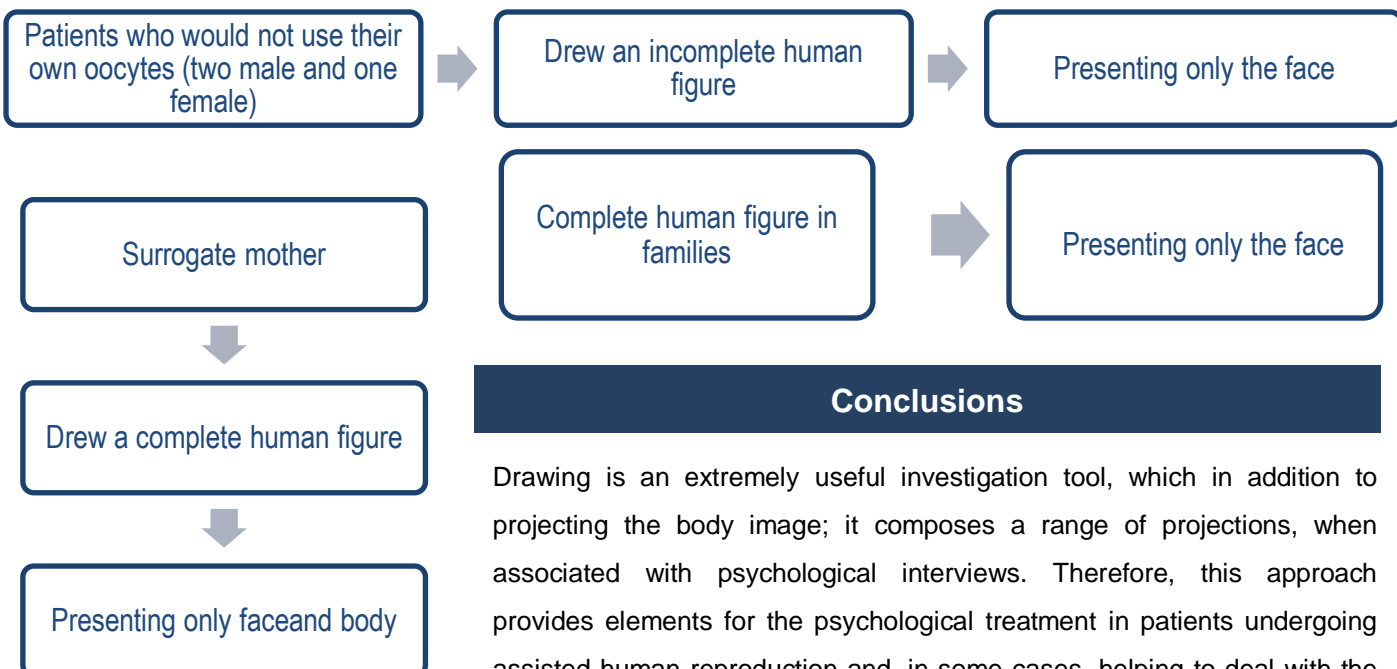
